While the goals, objectives and strategies contained in this Plan are fairly comprehensive, they will be reevaluated annually and implemented through an Annual Plan of Work.



Background and Context

Cawaco RC&D was established in 1979 and received 501(c)(3) nonprofit status in 1994. The RC&D program was developed based on the premise the local people, working together, can identify and solve problems and realize opportunities that enhance the quality of life. Cawaco plans and supports activities that increases conservation of natural resources, economic and human development and is actively involved in the management of multi-county, cross-jurisdictional projects.

The Board of Directors sets goals, objectives and standards of excellence. Through public input, Board direction and needs assessments, Cawaco RC&D works to identify unmet community needs and develop solutions to meet those needs.

Cawaco's Organizational Competencies

- ➤ <u>Identification of unmet needs:</u> Through our network of partners, which includes legislators, county commissions, federal and state agencies, municipalities, foundations and other nonprofits, Cawaco is able to identify key projects that, if implemented, can make a profound difference in a community.
- Grant fund administration: Cawaco manages funds provided by the Alabama Association of Resource Conservation and Development Councils. These funds are focused on educational and community development projects.
- Program delivery mechanism: Partners may identify a solution, but need assistance to administer or deliver a program. Cawaco is experienced with the administration and management of grants, contracts or coordination of personnel to deliver programs benefitting area communities.
- ➤ <u>Address complex issues:</u> Cawaco facilitates working groups to identify creative, workable and costeffective solutions that address complex issues.

DESCRIPTION OF PROGRAMS

AARCDC GRANT PROGRAM

Cawaco receives funds from the Alabama Association of Resource Conservation & Development Councils to provide competitive grants to small towns and nonprofits who otherwise would not receive funding from other major funders or agencies. Grant funds per project range between \$2,000 and \$5,000. Projects funded include community development and educational.

TOOL TRAILER


In 2011, Cawaco RC&D received a grant from ADECA to purchase and equip a trailer to assist groups in developing and maintaining recreational trails. Existing park staff and/or volunteers are allowed to borrow the trailer which is equipped with hand tools for trail building. Charles Yeager at the Turkey Creek Nature Preserves manages the use of the trailer and provides regular reports of its use.



ALABAMA RIVERS & STREAMS NETWORK (ARSN)

ARSN is group of state and federal agencies, utilities, private companies,

non-profit organizations that work together to identify opportunities for the restoration and recovery of imperiled aquatic species through science-based actions. The primary action of this group is to coordinate field work and studies. ARSN also provides scientific support for the Alabama Water Policy initiative.



The US F&WS will provide funding to Cawaco RC&D for the purpose of administering monetary assistance to landowners who perform remediation practices that improve habitat for threatened, endangered and atrisk species on private land.

YOUR TOWN ALABAMA

Since 1998, the Your Town Alabama organization has conducted yearly community design and planning workshops for town officials and community leaders across Alabama. The workshop introduces citizens interested in improving their community to asset-based design in community planning. This method focuses on the inventory and utilization of the community's best assets (cultural, natural resources, historical). Cawaco RC&D was one of the founding members of Your Town Alabama.
